Definition: a digital environment for collaboration and participation, where all have the ability to contribute, and knowledge and understanding (meaning) is a social negotiation.

Tools of the Read Write Web:

Blogs: personal publishing tools **Wikis:** collaborative Web publishing

Podcasting: audio files in mp3 format, created and distributed by individuals on almost any

subject

Screencasting: a movie made from the caputure of multiple screen images, can also be done

with PowerPoint imagery.

Flickr: online photo sharing

Furl: social bookmarking

Del.icio.us: social bookmarking

RSS: really simple syndication, a subscription feed, a stream of content, collected in the

aggregator.

Aggregator: software used to collect syndication feeds, like a "digital mailbox."
